## **Appendix G: Town of Berlin Resource Targets and Conservation Priorities**

Berlin is largely forested with most of its area located on the Rensselaer Plateau in the west and in the Taconics in the east. These regions have extensive high priority ecological areas, providing habitat for large mammals and many birds, and helping maintain water quality in streams such as the Poesten Kill, Black River, and Kronk Brook that have their headwaters in these areas. The town contains important connections between the Plateau and the Taconics, and these connections extend to the Green Mountains further east. The Taconics have extensive areas of public lands, including Taconic Ridge State Forest, Berlin State Forest and lands belonging to the Conservation Fund. The Rensselaer Plateau also has extensive public holdings including Cherry Plain State Wildlife Management Area and lands belonging to the Conservation Fund. Small areas of high priority agricultural resources can be found along NYS 22. The Rensselaer Plateau, the Taconics and many of the public lands contain or have adjacent high priority scenic areas. The Plateau also has several areas of high priority water resources. On the east side of Rte 22 in some areas are hills with less acidic bedrock, unusual in the county, that support uncommon habitat and plants.
