Town of Stephentown Resource Targets and Conservation Priority Areas

The Town of Stephentown is in the southeast corner of the county. Most of the town is forested, but there are high priority agricultural areas in the NYS 22 corridor. Approximately one half of the town is within the Rensselaer Plateau, and part of the Taconic Mountains are in the east. These two regions have high priority ecological and scenic areas. Public lands in the Taconics include Taconic Ridge State Park and lands of the Conservation Fund. On the plateau, Cherry Plain State Wildlife Management Area as well as Conservation Fund lands can be found north of NYS 43. The Kinderhook Creek corridor has high priority water resource, ecological, and climate resiliency areas. In the western part of town, an extensive area of high priority water resources can be found on either side of South Road that includes Black Brook and Huff Brook. Other high priority water resource areas are East Brook and West Brook and Wyomanock Creek in the southeast corner of the town. The Wyomanock Creek corridor includes some rare wetland habitats and associated uncommon plants. On the east side of Rte 22 in some areas are hills with less acidic bedrock, unusual in the county, that support uncommon habitat and plants.
