

## Appendix V: City of Troy Resource Targets and Conservation Priority Areas

The City of Troy, although highly urbanized, has extensive high priority scenic areas, including along the Wynants Kill and at Oakwood Cemetery. The Wynants Kill corridor also is a high priority water resource area. Oakwood Cemetery, a high priority ecological area and climate resiliency area, has uncommon rocky slope and ridgetop habitats and plants. The Hudson River shoreline also has some high priority ecological areas. Several parks, including Frear Park, Prospect Park, and Burden Pond Park, are large public open space areas.
